Walk along the same streets that Benjamin Franklin, George Washington and John Adams walked as you hear the dramatic story of America’s fight for freedom and the men and women who created the nation. You will see the Liberty Bell; the hallowed symbol of our nation’s freedom; Independence Hall where the Declaration of Independence was signed; Congress Hall, where Congress sat while Philadelphia was the capital of the United States from 1790 to 1800; Franklin Court, the site of Benjamin Franklin’s home and print shop; Christ Church where many of our Founding Fathers worshipped; the Betsy Ross house, the home of the seamstress who sewed our first “Stars and Stripes”; and Elfreth’s Alley, the oldest continuously residential street in the country.

The Encampment at Valley Forge is the epic story of an army’s struggle to survive not only the brutal winter of 1777-78 but also its ability to continue as a fighting force. Your guide will share the living history as you travel through the countryside where General George Washington and his beleaguered Continental Army withdrew after the Battle of Germantown. Featured sites include the farmhouse that Washington used as his headquarters, soldiers’ huts, earthen fortifications, the Memorial Chapel and the Memorial Arch.

Enticing aromas will greet you as you enter Philadelphia's **Reading Terminal Market**. As you tour this vibrant and historic landmark you will learn the history of the market as well as the stories behind Philly's favorite sandwiches such as cheesesteaks and hoagies; breakfast foods such as scrapple and sticky buns; and snacks such as soft pretzels and Goldenberg Peanut Chews; and other Philly food specialties. And be sure to leave room to enjoy some small food bites along the way.

Then it's on to the world-renowned **Italian Market** in South Philly. This is the oldest and largest working outdoor market in the United States. Still predominantly Italian, it offers the best of many cultures and cuisines to the shopper.

You will visit Termini Brothers Bakery, a Philadelphia landmark; and another family owned and operated business, DiBruno Brothers "House of Cheese". This old world European-style cheese shop features over 400 different types of cheese and an overwhelming variety of gourmet foods from around the world.

This customized tour showcases the freedoms we have from the United States Constitution and the consequences of the loss of those freedoms.

The National Constitution Center is the first museum that celebrates the freedoms we have from the United States Constitution. Learn what it means to be an American through over 100 inspiring, interactive exhibits along with the powerful, award-winning theatrical performance "Freedom Rising".

Eastern State Penitentiary was constructed in the 1820s as part of a radical movement to rehabilitate criminals through solitary confinement. It was once the most famous and expensive prison in the world and was known for its grand, gothic architecture and strict prison discipline. Abandoned in 1971 it is now a lost world of crumbling cell-blocks and empty guard towers. Glimpse into the cells and uncover the past of some of America's most famous criminals including Willie Sutton and Al Capone.

William Penn planned the "City of Brotherly Love" between two rivers, the Schuylkill on the west side and the Delaware on the east side. Starting at one river and end at the other, this driving tour offers a panorama of our wonderful city and neighborhoods.

Take in the sites along the Benjamin Franklin Parkway (the Champs Elysees of Philadelphia) then travel through the center of the city to see the Comcast Center and City Hall. Continue your tour along Broad Street (the Avenue of the Arts) as your guide shows you the Academy of Music and the Kimmel Center for the Performing Arts. A drive along Pine Street past Antique Row and Pennsylvania Hospital (the nation's first hospital) will bring you into Society Hill to see a bit of this charming 18th century neighborhood.

By now you have reached the east side of the city where you will find the most historic square mile in the United States. Learn about the people and events that occurred in such buildings as Independence Hall, Congress Hall, Carpenters' Hall, Franklin Court and Christ Church.

PHILADELPHIA IN HIGH STYLE

In the 18 th century, Philadelphia’s wealthy citizens spared no expense in building, decorating and entertaining. Perhaps this is part of the reason that so many of their houses have survived to provide a reflection of the grandeur that existed in colonial Philadelphia. Step back in time as you explore some of the aspects of the gracious living that marked the 18 th century aristocrat. You will have the opportunity to visit two of these historic houses, the Powel House in Society Hill and another in Fairmount Park.	
The Powel House is perhaps America’s finest existing Georgian Colonial townhouse. Located in Society Hill, it was the home of Samuel and Elizabeth Powel, a colonial “power couple” who entertained everyone who was anyone around the time of the American Revolution.	
You will then travel out to Fairmount Park for a tour of one of the restored early American houses tucked away in Fairmount Park. These houses were built as summer homes for the city’s colonial elite to provide a respite from the heat and stench of the crowded city. Of course there was no respite from entertaining and these houses reflect the tastes and styles of their former owners.	



MURAL ARTS

Philadelphia’s “Mural Arts” program has evolved into the world’s largest collection of outdoor public art. This tour will introduce you to some of these murals as you learn about the artists, the artistic process and the history of the diverse communities that serve as the backdrop for this unique art form.	
This program is one of the nation’s most innovative art programs. It began in 1984 as a component of the city’s Anti-Graffiti Network, an effort to eradicate the graffiti crisis plaguing the city. They hired muralist Jane Golden to reach out to graffiti writers and to redirect their energies from destructive graffiti writing to constructive mural painting. And the rest is history.
